Identity Theft Victim Checklist

- Create an Identity Theft Report
 - File report with Federal Trade Commission. Print a copy. It will be called an Identity Theft Affidavit [www.ftc.gov (1-877-FTC-HELP)]
 - File report with local police department
 - Your FTC Identity Theft Affidavit along with your police report make an Identity Theft Report
 - You can use the Identity Theft Report to:
 - get fraudulent information removed from your credit report
 - stop a company from collecting debts that result from identity theft
 - place an extended fraud alert on your credit report
 - get information from companies about accounts the identity thief opened or misused
 - Call credit bureaus to file fraud alert and obtain credit report

- Contact financial institutions to flag accounts for suspicious activity
- Change passwords and pin numbers
- Fill out and return any fraud affidavits sent by merchants
- Call all credit providers. Make sure they have your correct address

- Alert nearest Postal Inspector's Office 1-877-876-2455
- Alert DMV & Get a new email address
- Keep accurate and complete records including the names of people with whom you discussed your case
